## **Nardi's 60th Anniversary**

11<sup>th</sup> October 2007



**Nardi-Personal S.p.A.** celebrates its *60th Anniversary* by promoting a special and unique event. During the period from 26<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> October, the "Auto and Moto d'Epoca" Exhibition taking place in Padova, Italy, will feature a display of 5 Nardi sports and racing cars. This is the first time that enthusiasts will be able to admire so many Nardi cars all together.

The sports cars built by Nardi during the fifties are lovingly preserved by their enthusiast owners: the cars which presently reside in Italy number less than ten and some of them have not been shown to the public in more than 30 years!

However, for this very special occasion, these collectors have given their consent to exhibit them all together.

The following cars will be exhibited:

- **Nardi Danese 'Boby' 750 cc 1947:** The first sports car which won in 1947 the "Coppa d'Oro delle Dolomiti" ("The Cup of the Dolomites"), rescued from oblivion after 47 years in the U.S.A. and now living again in Italy
- **Nardi Danese 'Marco' 1500 cc 1947:** The car in which the first 8-cylinder engine built by Ferrari Auto Avio Costruzioni was installed
- **Nardi 'Blatta' 750 cc 1950:** Assembled by Scuderia mechanical workshop in Palermo
- **Nardi Sighinolfi 750 cc 1952:** Assembled in Modena by Sighinolfi, Ferrari's pilot and test driver
- **Nardi 750 cc 1955:** Barchetta Motto-styled and the last racing car built by Enrico Nardi
